This issue of "The Reflector" is dedicated to you, Walter Williams, by the Class of 1942. Many of our students have enjoyed the opportunity of your musical instruction; others have found their lives enriched as they listened to your presentations.

HISTORY OF THE CLASS OF '42

Our high school days are practically through,
For the students of '42,
Let us go back four years to review,
The outstanding events in our Gold and Blue.

In 1939, 34 greenhorn freshmen entered room 31, all full of pep and vim, with Mr. McCaw as our home room teacher. Out of the 34 students, there were nine from Cutchogue, Oregon, and Laurel. The class elected John Bermingham as president, Barbara Bergmann as vice-president, and Stephen Tuthill as treasurer. We liked Stephen's work and cooperation so well, that we elected him as class treasurer in all our school years. At the end of our freshman year, we celebrated by having a class picnic at the Marratooka Club House.

There were only 30 pupils entering the sophomore year. Five had left school, but Charlotte Haas rejoined her classmates, after going to Riverhead High School for three years. This year we elected Patricia McBride to our class presidency, while Albert Grohoski was chosen as our vice-president.

Our junior year was a busy one. First of all we elected Hedwig Herman, Walter Krupski, and

Sidney P. Tuthill Jr., as class president, vice-president, and secretary respectively. We dickered a long time about our class rings but we finally made a good choice. Next on the program, came the Junior Prom. The committee did a fine job of decorating, and Barbara Bergmann and Hedwig Herman helped with the entertainment.

We entered our senior year to find that for the first time in our high school career that we didn't have Mr. McCaw for our class adviser. We now had Miss Hoyt to help us over the rough spots of a senior class. Barbara Bergmann was elected president. Frank McNulty, vice-president, and Catherine Donnelly, secretary. Of course, as we mentioned before, Stephen Tuthill still was our treasurer. Our first project this year was to help the General Organization put over the magazine campaign, which was declared by all a success. Next all of us helped the Minstrel Show, many of the Seniors taking prominent parts. The Senior Play, "Mama's Baby Boy" was presented in March with many seniors in the leading roles. Miss Arndt had charge of this successful play. The final extra-curricular activity was the Senior Trip, which most of you have probably heard about.

And so we take our leave of our beloved Alma Mater, Mattituck High School, with the knowledge that our years here have not been wasted, and that they were the happiest years of our lives - ones that we shall never forget.
